York County Investigating Grand Jury Recommends Criminal Homicide Charges in 2018 Shooting Death of Phillip Banks

York, PA — District Attorney Dave Sunday announced that charges surrounding the May 2018, shooting death of Phillip Banks were filed last week. These charges follow an investigation by the York City Police Department, York County District Attorney's Office, and a recommendation by the York County Investigating Grand Jury.

Antonio Jones, 22, of York City, Trayquan Robinson, 23, of North York Borough and Tyler Orr, 26, of York Township, were all charged with Criminal Homicide and Criminal Conspiracy. These charges were approved by Grand Jury Supervising Judge Maria Musti Cook.

"The grand jury presentment provides an overview of evidence presented in this case, including testimony of witnesses and footage from multiple surveillance videos," District Attorney Sunday said.

The presentment concluded that on May 21, 2018, Antonio Jones, Trayquan Robinson and Tyler Orr engaged in the premeditated shooting death of Phillip Banks.

"We think this best evidences the continued dedication to our victims and families by our local District Attorney's Office; and their commitment to the pursuit of justice, no matter how long it takes, no matter how deep they have to dig, to get it done. The community deserves that level of tenacity from both its Officers and Prosecutors. That's what their getting and it's making a difference," York City Police Commissioner Mike Muldrow said.

Antonio Jones and Trayquan Robinson are both in custody and have had their preliminary arraignments. An arrest warrant has been issued for Tyler Orr. Anyone with information on the whereabouts of Orr is asked to contact the York City Police Department.

Criminal charges, and any discussion thereof, are merely allegations and all defendants are presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.
