1 Individual Charged with Murder of the 1st Degree by York City Police Department in October 2021 Shooting Death

York, PA – On Wednesday, May 14, 2025, York City Police Department filed charges in the October 15, 2021 shooting death of victim, Larry Jones. Kyle Wilson, 36, of York City, has been charged with Murder of the First Degree (H1) and Persons Not to Possess Firearms (F1).

The investigation revealed that, on October 15, 2021 at approximately 10:25PM, York City Police Department officers were dispatched to a shooting at the 400 block of West Princess Street, York, PA 17401. The victim, found lying in the roadway with multiple gunshot wounds, was transported to York Hospital where he succumbed to his injuries.

Video surveillance obtained revealed the suspect operating a Mercury Mountaineer as the sole occupant of the vehicle, circling the area prior to the homicide, arriving at the 400 block of West Princess Street, stopping next to the victim, engaging in discussion with the victim through the driver's side front window, and subsequently discharging 9 shots from a handgun at him. The suspect then fled southbound. The physical description of Wilson matches video surveillance and eyewitness statements. Cell phone records placed Wilson in York City 15 minutes prior to the homicide and showed continued movement south to the Laurel, MD area afterward. At the time of apprehension, Wilson was the sole occupant of the Mercury Mountaineer.

District Attorney Tim Barker said "I extend my appreciation and gratitude to the York City Police Department and lead investigator, Detective Frank Clark, for the arrest of Kyle Wilson in the 2021 shooting death of Larry Jones. This was labor intensive investigation requiring the cooperation of multiple agencies throughout many jurisdictions, as well as the use of multiple forensic and technological investigative

tools. The York City Police Department again showed that they will never stop pursuing justice for the victims of gun violence.”

Also assisting with this investigation were the York City School Police, York County District Attorney’s Office, and St. Bernard Parish Sheriff’s Office, Louisiana.

Criminal charges, and any discussion thereof, are merely allegations and all defendants are presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.
